

First Persecution (1-7,13-18): begins from within

The Persecutors (1,5-6)

- Sadducees liberals, did not believe in resurrection, top level authorities
- Priests responsible for ceremonial activities
- Captain Temple police
- Annas high Priest (Jesus taken to Annas, John 18:13,24)
- Caiphas Son-in-law of Annas, Presided over the trial of Jesus
- John & Alexander
- Rulers, elders, and scribes
- Other members from Priestly Descent

Why were they grieved or deeply disturbed by Peter and John? (verse 2)

- Peter and John posed a threat to the Temple establishment
 - Their teachings contradicted Teachings of the Temple
 - They testified of the resurrection of Lord Jesus Christ
 - People were being convicted ... Mass conversions

What is Sanhedrin?

- Jewish court system with final authority on Jewish law
- Anyone going against their ruling could be put to death.
- 71 Members with high Priest with the senior rank

Deuteronomy 16:18

"You shall appoint judges and officers in all your gates, which the LORD your God gives you, according to your tribes, and they shall judge the people with just judgment.

Why 71 Judges?

Numbers 11:16 And the LORD said unto Moses, Gather unto me <u>seventy men of the elders</u> of Israel, whom thou knowest to be the elders of the people, and officers over them; and bring them unto the tabernacle of the congregation, that they may stand there with thee.

What was the verdict?

• Question (v.7):

...by what power or by what name have you done this? (Mathew 21:23, Jesus was asked the same question)

• Verdict (v. 18):

And they called them, and commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Jesus.

2. Peter & John's Response (8-12, 19-20):

- Were Peter & John surprised that they were being persecuted?
- What gave them the courage to speak boldly?
- What were their messages to the persecutors?
- What was their bold response to the verdict?
- Does their response contradict Romans 13:1-2?

Peter and John <u>not surprised</u> by the Persecution

- Warned by the Lord in Mathew 10:17-20
 - 17"But beware of men, for they will hand you over to the courts and scourge you in their synagogues; 18 and you will even be brought before governors and kings for My sake, as a testimony to them and to the Gentiles. 19"But when they hand you over, do not worry about how or what you are to say; for it will be given you in that hour what you are to say. 20"For it is not you who speak, but it is the Spirit of your Father who speaks in you.

Source of Peter's boldness and message

7 And when they had set them in the midst, they asked, By what power, or by what name, have ye done this? ⁸ Then Peter, **filled with the Holy Ghost**, said unto them, Ye rulers of the people, and elders of Israel,

 Holy Ghost gave the courage and the message to speak to Jewish court (Peter and John were uneducated fisherman)

Peter's 3 messages

Focus: Jesus Christ (similar to messages in chapters 2 and 3)

Message #1: Message of crucifixion and resurrection (v.10)

Message #2: Message of rejected stone becoming the chief corner stone (v.11) (Psalms 118:22-23, Isaiah 28:16)

Message #3: Message of ONLY ONE way (v.12) (John 14:6)

What was their bold response to the verdict?

 Verdict (V.18) ... commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Jesus

• Response (19, 20). ¹⁹ But Peter and John answered and said unto them, Whether it be right in the sight of God to hearken unto you more than unto God, judge ye. ²⁰ For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard.

• Does the response contradict Romans 13:1-2? No, our first allegiance is to the principles of God's word.

3. Church's Response (23-30)

What did Peter & John do after being released?

What did Peter & John do after being released? What was the pattern in prayer?

• Peter and John reported back to the believers in church (verse 23)

Pattern: in one accord, Worship followed by Supplication

Three prayer requests

1. Ask God to look into the threats (Judgement and vengeance left to God)

Do not avenge yourselves, beloved, but leave room for God's wrath. For it is written: "Vengeance is Mine; I will repay, says the Lord." Romans 12:19

2. Courage to speak with boldness (to continue the great commission)

3. Signs & wonders (healing)

4. God's Response

Verse 31 "And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all <u>filled</u> with the Holy Ghost, and they <u>spake</u> the word of God with boldness"

Verse 33 And with great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus: and great grace was upon them all.

Were all the prayers answered?

5. Caring church at Jerusalem ... *Love in action* (32-37) What does the Lord expect from us today?

32 ... were of one heart and one soul ...34 Neither was there any among them that lacked: for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the prices of the things that were sold, ³⁵ And laid them down at the apostles' feet: and distribution was made unto every man according as he had need.

- John 13:34 ... That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. (high standard of love) ...
- Lord expects us to be loving, sensitive to respond with compassion to the needs of others (especially those in the local church).

Important themes/moral lessons/application

REVELATION + APPLICATION = TRANSFORMATION

Wait + Witness with the power of the Holy Spirit Acts 1:

Repent & Be Baptized, and be added to local church Acts 2:

7 qualities of local church (most important ... Be Steadfast in Word. Prayer. Communion. Fellowship)

Ministry to one lame person can open doors to bigger ministry Acts 3:


Peter's approach to witnessing
