"and they continued steadfastly in the **apostles doctrine** (or teaching) ..." Acts 2:42

Apostle? ... one who is 'sent' or 'appointed' by the Lord with His authority

Indisciples & Matthais (Judas replacement)
 Disciples were with Jesus and he taught them: Luke 24:44-49, I John 1:1

Paul (inspired by the Spirit, Galatians 1:15-18, John 16:12,13)

□ Jude & James (not called apostles but contributed to the NT)

Seventy sent by the Lord (Luke 10:1)

"and they continued steadfastly in the **apostles doctrine** (or teaching) ..." Acts 2:42

□ The Church was built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone (Ephesians 2:20)

□ The foundation is now complete ... so there is no need for new apostolic teachings or additional books to the Bible (new teachings/revelations will be false teachings). We need to build on the foundation of Christ (I Corinthians 3:10-15)

□ Apostles honored in Heaven (Revelation 21:14)

What should be our response to apostles doctrine?

LISTEN "He that heareth you, heareth me; and he that despiseth you, despiseth me; and he that despiseth me, despiseth him that sent me" (Luke 10:16)

READ "give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine" (I Timothy 4:13) why? ... "save thyself, and those that hear thee" (I Timothy 4:16)

AVOID: Paul's counsel on those who reject the sound doctrines of the apostles ... avoid them!(Romans 16:17,18)

Marks of apostleship

¹¹ I have made a fool of myself, but you drove me to it. I ought to have been commended by you, for I am not in the least inferior to the "super-apostles,"^[a] even though I am nothing. ¹² I persevered in demonstrating among you the marks of a true apostle, including signs, wonders and miracles. (II Corinthians 12:11-12)


- Paul's preaching of Christ & Kingdom of God
- Paul's teachings and writings (Paul was not with Jesus as the disciples, but was inspired by the Holy Spirit)
- Paul's fruitful ministry souls saved, saints strengthened

Epistles in the New Testament

- Epistle means letter or message
- Authors of 21 Epistles in the New Testament
 - Apostle Paul 13 (see next slide)
 - Apostle Peter (one of 12 disciples) I and II Peter
 - Apostle John (one of 12 disciples) I, II, III John
 - James (half-brother of Jesus) James
 - Jude (half-brother of Jesus) Jude
 - Hebrews author unknown
- Other 6 Books in NT: Mathew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts, Revelation

Paul's titles in his Epistles: Servant, Apostle, Prisoner

- Romans Servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle
- I & II Corinthians Apostle of Jesus Christ, through the will of God
- Galatians Apostle
- Ephesians an Apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God
- Philippians Servant of Jesus Christ
- Colossians Apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God
- I & II Thessalonians not given
- I Timothy Apostle of Jesus Christ by the commandment of God
- Il Timothy Apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God
- Titus Servant of God and Apostle of Jesus Christ
- Philemon Prisoner of Jesus Christ

Introduction to Colossians



- Written by Paul from Prison around 60 AD
 - Paul wrote to believers that he had never met
 - Epaphras is credited with bringing the gospel to Colosse (1:7); Believers maybe converts from worshippers of Greek and Roman gods
- Colosse a City in the province of Phyrgia (Asia Minor). Paul was in Phyrgia (Acts 16:16, 18:23) but not Colosse.

• What is the greatest threat to Christians attending church?

Greatest threat to Christians in church... false teachings

Acts 20:28-31 Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood. I know that after I leave, savage wolves will come in among you and will not spare the flock. Even from your own number men will arise and distort the truth in order to draw away disciples after them. So be on your guard!

Paul's main motivation for writing the epistle: To address false teachings that was creeping into Colossian church and causing confusion

knowledge/mystery revealed to only a few ... <u>danger</u>: leads to cults
 Christ not equal with God (or one of the gods) ... <u>danger</u>: leads to idol worship
 Need to follow traditions of Judaism ... <u>danger</u>: leads to grace + works for salvation

 Paul highlights the 'Supremacy and Sufficiency of Christ' inspiring us to give him the Preeminence in our lives

Important Theme in chapter 1

Supremacy of Lord Jesus Christ (1:15-19, 20-23)

Introductory Greeting (1: 1-8)

Who was Paul? Where was he writing from? How does he address believers? When did Paul meet them? What words does Paul use to greet believers? What is he thankful for? Who is Epaphras?

Greetings to believers

- Paul introduced himself as ... an apostle of Jesus Christ (1) (Paul's first allegiance to Jesus Christ) (Galatians 1:1)
- How does he address believers? (2)
 - God's holy people
 - faithful brothers & sisters

- When did Paul meet them?
 - Never
 - He heard of them through Epaphras, fellow prisoner in Rome (7)
 - ✓ Do we have the same burden and love for believers we have never met? Is it easy to pray for strangers?

Christian Greetings: Grace Triple Peace

o"Grace" and "Peace" (2)

OGrace and Peace came from God through Christ

 Grace – God's undeserved free favor in our life (not dependent on our character or works or background)

✓ God's grace in our life leads to Triple Peace:

- + Peace with Heavenly father
- + inner peace
- + peace with others

(Triple peace cannot be bought or earned, and is not available in the world!)

What is Paul thankful for?

- We always thank God for (3-6)... faith, hope, love
 - Faith in Christ Jesus
 - Love for all God's people
 - Hope of Heaven
 - Root of Faith, Hope & Love: Message of the gospel and God's grace
 - Fruit: Faith accompanied by works (spreading of gospel & other works)
 - Foundation: The foundation for our love, ministry, and works should be the gospel truth

• Epaphras – fellow servant, faithful minister, teacher (7,8)

Paul's Apostolic Prayer (1:9-14)

What is the Focus of Paul's prayer? (9-11)

What is Paul thankful for? (12-14)

Paul's 3-fold prayer for believers (9-11)

1. Filled with knowledge of God's will, in wisdom and understanding

(need wisdom to apply the knowledge, and spiritual understanding of the truths)

<u>Result</u>

- walk as children of God (Purpose of heavenly knowledge is heavenly walk)
- fruitful (Ephesians 2:10 we are created for good works, Titus 3:8 we must maintain good works)

Paul's prayer for believers (9-11)

2. Increase in knowledge

(grow in knowledge ... we never stop learning)

(Jesus grew in wisdom-Luke 2:52; still babes, I Corinthians 3:1-2, grow in grace and knowledge of the Lord, II Peter 3:18)

3. Strengthened with all might To build our strength and endurance to suffer in patience and longsuffering with joy

- Patience silent endurance; Longsuffering no retaliation
- Strengthened in inner man (Ephesians 3:16)

Paul's joyful Thanks to the Father (12-14)

Father who has (made possible by the Father, not our works):

- **1. Qualified us** to be partakers of the inheritance of saints ... initiated by the father, not by our works
- 2. Delivered us from the power of darkness (IPeter 2:9, Ephesians 5:8)
- 3. Brought us into the Kingdom of Son ...
 - Made possible by Redemption through the blood of Christ (price paid for our release and forgiveness of sins)



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
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Exaltation of Lord Jesus Christ (1:15-20)

How does Paul highlight the supremacy of Christ?

In whom does all fulness dwell?

Supremacy of Christ, the Son of God (15-19)



#1 Jesus is the image of the Invisible God (15)

- God is Invisible (John 4:24 God is a spirit; I Timothy 1:17 invisible; John 1: 18 – no one has seen God)
- Jesus represents the invisible God (man was also made in the image of God, Genesis 1:27 but not the true representative as image of man is marred and no longer reflects the attributes of God) (Hebrews 1:3 Jesus ... exact representation of His being, NIV)
- John 14:8, 9 Philip "show us the Father" ... Jesus "He who has seen me has seen the Father"

#2 Jesus is the Firstborn (15)

Does not refer to the first child born (Jesus was not created) Jesus existed before the beginning (Proverbs 8:23) but refers to the superiority of position that Jesus enjoys

(Genesis 25:23 Jacob considered first-born even though born second, Exodus 4:22 Israel considered first born;
Psalms 89:27 Messiah called the first born, supreme King;
Hebrews 1:2 Son is appointed heir of all things)

#3 Jesus is the Creator(16)

by Him were all things created (in heaven, in earth, visible and invisible) (thrones, dominions, principalities, and powers – they are subject to Him, I Peter 3:22)

created by Him & for Him (John 1:3– all things were made by Him)

Who is Jesus? #4 Jesus Sustains Creation (17)

 He is BEFORE all things, existed before the beginning (John 1:1, John 8:58, Proverbs 8:23, Revelation 22:13)

> "I was set up from everlasting, from the beginning, or before the earth was" **Proverbs 8:23**

Jesus was with the Father before the world was" (Jesus prayer, John 17:5)

• He **SUSTAINS** all things in the created universe (Hebrews 1:3, upholds all things by His power)

#5 Jesus is head of the body, the Church (18)

* As head, He should have the preeminence and full control

#6 Jesus is the firstborn from the dead (18)

- * Others rose again from dead before Jesus
- * but Jesus is first one to rise from the dead, and never die again!
- * first fruit of them that slept (I Corinthians 15:20)

#7 In Jesus, all the fullness of God dwells (19)

Reconciliation

- <u>Meaning</u>: Restoration to former self or healing of broken relationships
- Sin brought curse and God's wrath on all of creation:
 - Man (Genesis 3:14-19)
 - Ground (Genesis 3:17)
 - Angels (Job 4:18)
 - Animals (Romans 8:19-22)
 - Stars (Job 25:5)
 - Heaven (Hebrews 9:23)
- We need deliverance from sin
- Who is reconciled?

Reconciliation

Who is reconciled?

- All things in earth and in heaven (1:20)
- All <u>who</u> who believed (1:21)

How are we Reconciled?

Through the death and blood of Christ (20-22) Without shedding of blood there is no remission (Hebrews 9:22) There is no other path for redemption of sinner

Reconciliation

Not reconciled

Satan, fallen angels (Jude 6), unbelievers ... will be eternally damned (Revelation)

✓ Philippians 2:10 ... all brought to subjection, but not all reconciled

Reconciliation leads to Transformation

- Holy
- Without blemish
- Free of accusation (Revelation 12:10, fate of accuser)

Must continue in faith & hope (23)

... Continuing is sign of true reconciliation or salvation experience (faith in the finished work of Christ on the cross)

... stand firm, let nothing move you (I Corinthians 15:58)

Paul's suffering and Paul's calling

- Why is Paul able to 'rejoice in suffering'?
 - Paul suffered for the gospel & church ... a joyful prisoner of Christ, considered it a privilege to suffer for Christ
 - What is our suffering?
 - Are we Suffering for Christ or are we suffering for self?
 - Are we Suffering for righteousness sake or Suffering because of sin?

Paul's calling

• What is Paul's calling?

- To proclaim the gospel (23) (as seen in Acts)
- To unlock the mystery of the Church (25-27) (as seen in Paul's epistles)
- To strengthen saints, through admonishing and teaching (28) (as seen in Acts and Paul's epistles)
- Paul's expectation of believers (28)
 - To bring believers to maturity (not just save and leave)

The mystery ... is no longer a mystery!

- Mystery (does not mean hidden and unknown ... it is revealed through divine revelation) (26) (eye hath not seen ... but God has revealed, I Corinthians 2:9-10)
- One of the greatest mystery ... Mystery of church of reconciling Jews and gentiles hidden in Old Testament, but now revealed. (Ephesians 3:1-12)
- Mystery of Church foretold by the Lord in Mathew 16:18 (I will build my church) Church started the day of the Pentecost deeper truths about church revealed through apostolic teachings.

Mystery #1 revealed

Glorious riches of this Mystery ... Christ in you, the hope of glory!(27)

Christ-in-us changes everything!

- 2. Israel's blindness (Romans 11:25)
- 3. Translation of living saints (I Corinthians 15:51-52)
- 4. Church as one body, with Jews and Gentiles (Ephesians 3:1-11, Colossians 4:3)
- 5. Church as bride of Christ (Ephesians 5:28-32)
- 6. Indwelling Christ (Colossians 1:26-27)
- 7. Christ as fulness of Godhead (Colossians 2:2,9)
- 8. Godliness (I Timothy 3:16)
- 9. Iniquity (II Thessalonians 2:7)
- 10. Seven stars (Revelation 1:20)

Source of Paul's tireless energy

" I strenuously contend with <u>all the energy</u> Christ so powerfully works in me" (29)

"My grace is sufficient for you" (II Corinthians 12:9) "Those who wait on the Lord will renew their strength" (Isaiah 40:31) "not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit" (Zechariah 4:6)
