





2. What does the king do in the morning?


Went in haste, very early (19) anxious to know about the welfare of Daniel

How and why was Daniel preserved?

Preserved by angels sent by God (22)

Daniel preserved because: of his innocence before God and king (22) faith in God (23)

King who sent Daniel to Lions' den pleased to see Daniel alive (23)





Are you afraid of Lions in your life?

FACT: We will face lions in our life

These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have <u>peace</u>. In the world ye shall have <u>tribulation</u>: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world. (John 16:33) Satan is like a roaring lion (I Peter 5:8)

FACT: Lions cannot harm us

We can sleep in peace, even in Lion's Den!

(Isaiah 26:3, Isaiah 54:17, Psalms 3:1,5,6)

Lions of this world cannot harm us!

Battle of God Vs. Lion: God wins all the time!

Punishment for accusers

Cast into the den of lions, along with their wives and children (24)

Is this extreme punishment? What is the rationale for killing the entire family?

Same lions ... Daniel saved, but his accusers destroyed

A new decree (26-27)

I make a decree, That in every dominion of my kingdom men tremble and fear before the God of Daniel: for he is the <u>living God</u>, and <u>stedfast</u> for ever, and his kingdom that which shall <u>not be destroyed</u>, and his dominion shall be even unto the end.

He <u>delivereth</u> and rescueth, and he worketh <u>signs and wonders</u> in heaven and in earth, who hath delivered Daniel from the power of the lions.

A new decree (26-27)

Supposedly unchanging decree (8, 15) ... now changed to honor the living God of Daniel

Change is possible in this world ... when God's children stand up for the truth!

"And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and <u>stand in the gap</u> before me for the land, that I should not destroy it: <u>but I found none</u>" (Ezekiel 22:30)

Daniel's continued success

- king Nebuchadnezzar <u>honors</u> Daniel for interpreting dream (2:48)
- king Belshazzar <u>honors</u> Daniel (5:29)
- Daniel <u>prospers</u> in the reign of Darius and Cyrus (6:28)

king Cyrus ...
return of Jews
from exile

Now in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, that the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah might be fulfilled, the Lord stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom, and put it also in writing, saying, ²Thus saith Cyrus king of Persia, The Lord God of heaven hath given me all the kingdoms of the earth; and he hath charged me to build him an house at <u>Ierusalem</u>, which is in Judah. ³ Who is there among you of all his people? his God be with him, and let him go up to Jerusalem, which is in Judah, and build the house of the Lord God of Israel, (he is the God,) which is in Jerusalem. (Ezra 1:1-3)
