Content: Chapters 1-6: Narrative; Chapter 7-12: Prophetic (4 visions)

Daniel: Meaning: God is my Refuge; Calling: Prophet;

Secular positions: Daniel held senior administrative positions under 4 Kings:

Nebuchadnezzar, Belshazzar, Darius, and Cyrus.

Recognized for/as: Courage, Convictions, Separated life, Prayer life, Integrity,

visions, Leadership, Wisdom, hero of faith.

God is wise and powerful (20)


God controls time and seasons (21)

Indestructible (44) - it shall never be destroyed (Hebrews 12:28, Kingdom that cannot be shaken)

Victorious (44) - it shall break in pieces and consume all other kingdoms

Eternal (44) - it shall stand forever (Revelation 11:15, He shall reign for ever)

Universal (35) – it shall became a great mountain and fill the whole earth



Daniel's continued success

- king Nebuchadnezzar <u>honors</u> Daniel for interpreting dream (2:48)
- king Belshazzar honors Daniel (5:29)
- Daniel <u>prospers</u> in the reign of Darius and Cyrus (6:28)

 Main Reason: Daniel 1:9 (God Honors those who Honor Him, I Samuel 2:30b) Memory Verse, Chapter 6

27 He delivereth and rescueth, and he worketh signs and wonders in heaven and in earth,

God's unchanging Attributes (as seen in chapters 1-6)

God knows everything

God is Just

God is merciful

God is our deliverer

God is always present (with us)

God is Sovereign (He is in absolute control)

God is Faithful (He honors those who honor Him)
