Paul's posture

On his knees

- Symbolic of reverence and humility
- Many examples of kneeling: Solomon (I Kings 8:54), Daniel (Daniel 6:10), Stephen (Acts 7:60), Peter (Acts 9:40) and many more ... Jesus prayed on His knees (Luke 22:41)
 - Kneeling is highly desirable, but not essential
- Examples of standing and praying: Abraham (Genesis 19:27), Mark 11:25

Prayer Request (16-19)

Strengthen with might by His Spirit in inner being

... that Christ may indwell

... Be Rooted in love

to comprehend and experience His Love

Source of answered prayers (16)

According to His Riches


- According = in proportion to His riches

#1 Inner Man Strengthened


SPIRITUAL POWER Strength in the inner man through His spirit.

We could be strong physically, and yet be weak in our inner man.

- Who is this "inner man'?
- Who is the 'inner man' in conflict with?
- Where does the Holy Spirit reside?
- Is the "Holy Spirit" same as the 'inner man'?
- How can we strengthen our 'inner man'?







"on the outside you appear to people as righteous but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness" (Matthew 23:28)

"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new" (II Corinthians 5:17) ... what becomes new?

"but though our outward man perish, yet the **inward man** is renewed day by day" (II Corinthians 4:16)

"Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God" (I John 3:9) ... who cannot sin? Why does a born again believer sin? How is victory achieved? (Romans 7:24,25, 12:1-2, Galatians 2:20, 5:16, Mark 14:38, Acts 2:42)

#2 Christ would dwell in their hearts

Indwelling Christ in a Believer (Christ enters at time of conversion, John 14:23, Revelation 3:20)

Jesus answered and said unto him, If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him (John 14:23)

Holy Spirit did not indwell a person in the Old Testament. Holy Spirit was given as needed in the OT.
