Epistle of James

Timing: around 45-50 AD

Author: James, brother of Jesus

Themes: (1) Be doers of God's word; (2) Good works must flow from our faith.

You will be Blessed, if:

You Respond to Trials with Joy

You are swift to hear, slow to speak, and slow to wrath

You are just and impartial

Your faith is accompanied by good works

You are Doer of the Word

You control your tongue

You are able to see your faults (rather than judge others)

Your life is aligned with God's will

You are not pursuing money

You strive for righteous living

You Pray

You encourage and restore weak believers

Ascending Blessing of Trials (1:3,4,12)

Trials (from God) test our faith

Joy + wisdom



Downward spiral of temptations

1:14 But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. 15 Then when <u>lust</u> hath conceived, it bringeth forth <u>sin</u>: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth <u>death</u>.



Be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath (1:19-20)

be doers of the Word, and not hearers only 1:22)

Pure religion

²⁷ Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world. Pure religion is centered on love.

Pure religion fulfills the two greatest commandments,

Loving God (by maintaining a spotless testimony) and

Loving others (by being sensitive to the needy, such as fatherless & widows)

Partiality taming of our tongues Heavenly & earthly wisdom

Chapter 2 & 3

Partiality is a sin (2:1-9)

- It violates God's commandment to love our neighbors
- It is not consistent with the character of God
- It is disrespectful to fellow humans created by God in His image



Dead Faith is:

Faith without Feelings
Faith without Empathy
Faith without convictions
Faith without boldness
Faith without value

Faith without works is dead (2:20)

Words/Texts/Tweets matter ...

Words can
destroy/damage ...

encourage, comfort,
strengthen, correct,
inspire, heal, reconcile,
forgive, etc.

The Power of Tongue

Tongue is a small part of body but exercises great influence, for better or for worse

⁵ Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. ⁶ The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body, sets the whole course of one's life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell

If unchecked, tongue corrupts whole body. ~1:26-27, 1:19

Who am I? a worshipper or a curser or both?

⁹ With it we bless our God and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the similitude of God. ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren,

these things ought not to be so. ¹¹ Does a spring send forth fresh *water* and bitter from the same opening? ¹² Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? ^[g]Thus no spring yields both salt water and fresh.

Worshipping and Cursing ...


Must not co-exist in a believer's life


Why guard our mouth?

How do we fix our sins of tongue? (and other sins)

Earthly Wisdom (3:15-16)

¹⁵ This wisdom does not descend from above, but *is* earthly, sensual, demonic **16**For where envy and selfseeking *exist*, confusion and every evil thing *are* there

Is Earthly, Sensual, Demonic

Earthly wisdom leads to confusion & Evil

Heavenly Wisdom leads to peace (17-18)

Pure ... holy or devoid of sin, pure intent Peaceable ... produces peace, not conflict Gentle .. mild or meek Willing to yield ... not stubborn (like the mule) or unteachable Merciful... wiling to forgive rather than judge/ condemn/punish Good Fruits/works No partiality No hypocrisy

Chapter 4

Source of Strife?

Where do wars and fights *come* from among you? Do *they* not *come* from your *desires* for pleasure that war in your members? (4:1)

Not others

But You

- Your (ungodly) Desires
- Your war (conflict between flesh & spirit)
- Your worldly perspective


Goal of church discipline (Mathew 18:15-17)

Member: To spiritually benefit the member guilty of sin

- **Restoration**, not condemnation (or excommunication)
- Restore to fellowship, once corrective active taken.

Church: To maintain the testimony of church

How to resolve strife?



Draw near to God... sins of heart & hand

Clean Hands (symbolizes external dealings ... what we do?)

Pure Hearts (symbolizes internal thoughts ... what we think?)

⁸ Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse *your* hands, *you* sinners; and purify *your* hearts, *you* doubleminded. ⁹ Lament and mourn and weep! Let your laughter be turned to mourning and *your* joy to gloom. ¹⁰ Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up. (4:8-10)

Deal with sins immediately (lament, mourn and weep) (True Repentance ... an intent to not repeat)

Man's plan ... looks very logical.

Destination: City

Justice and judgment are the habitation of thy throne: mercy and truth shall go before thy face (**Psalms 89:14**)

He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God? (Micah 6:8)

Prescription to the Oppressed

Be Patient

Don't grumble

Strengthen your hearts

Lessons from the farmer

Invests in the Future: Sows the seed

Exercises Stewardship: Labors in the field, waters, protects the field

Exercises Patience: Waits patiently for the outcome

Exercises Faith: Outcome/harvest not in his hands (controlled by God)

No need for swearing in daily conversations (12)

Speak the truth, always!



Some reasons for our physical sickness



Curse of Adam's sin and old age

Due to personal sins

Satanic attack

For our spiritual growth and For His glory

The righteous man

The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much (16)

Our righteousness comes from God through Christ

As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one: **Romans 3:10** For he hath made him *to be* sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him. **II Corinthians 5:21**

Imputed righteousness of Christ does not give us the freedom to live unrighteous lives. We must pursue a lifestyle of righteousness

"Job was perfect and up right, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil" (Job 1:1)

Some reasons for unanswered prayers

- Praying with unconfessed sin (Isaiah 59:1-2)
- Praying for wrong things (James 4:3)
- Seeking answers before the fulness of time (Galatians 4:4)
- Praying without faith (James 1:6)

Pray in Faith (James 1:6, 5:15 Hebrews 11:6)

Keys to effective prayer & Blessing

Be fervent (serious, intense, passionate) (16) (such as Daniel, Moses, Hannah)

Be righteous (16) (imputed righteousness of Christ + our righteous living) (Job 1:1)

Blessing: avails much!

Prescription for Healing

Physical Sickness

Prayer

+ faith

+ oil (medicine)

* Repeat until healed or God's will revealed

Spiritual Sickness

Confession

* Only one <u>true</u> confession needed

Ministry of restoration

Restore other believers, in love, using the wisdom of scriptures

Brethren, if any of you do err from the truth, and one convert him; Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins (19, 20)

Correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction (II Timothy 4:2, NIV)

Change yourself, Change others

Are you a progressing Believer?

Progress in our spiritual life leads to **Satisfaction** in this life and **Reward** at the end.

Progress **requires** being "doers of God's Word" (James 1:22)
